Reflection

The little girl was six years of age, but already guite a formidable young lady. She inherited a lot of her mother's stubbornness, and from an early age, there were frequent clashes of personality. One day, things came to a head. The mother grabbed a stool, placed it in a corner, and told the girl to sit there, and wait till her Dad came home. She refused to sit, despite all her mother's threats. Eventually, her mammy, in sheer frustration, lifted her daughter up and plonked her down in a sitting position on the stool. Shortly afterwards Dad arrived home. He noticed his daughter sitting on the stool, with a look on her face that could kill. "Well, what's this all about?" he enquired, trying to be cheery, "What are you doing there in the corner?" The reply was blurted out ... " Dad! On the outside ... I'm sitting down ... but inside I'm still STANDING UP!!"

Moral: That's the story of Lent. Jesus wants us to soften our iron will. Otherwise, even God Himself cannot reach us ... because He has given us Free Will, while our little stay lasts here.
