Take off Your Shoes

Reflection: One Sunday morning a children's program leader noticed a little girl standing outside the room, looking in with great eagerness at the fun the other children were having. The leader went outside and invited the little girl inside.

"They'll all laugh at me."

"Why do you think that my little friend?"

"Because I don't have any shoes."

Heartbroken at this little girl's poverty, and knowing that she really wanted to join in, the leader tried to convince the little girl that the other kids would not laugh at her. But despite her assurances the leader could not persuade the little girl to join in with the other kids. Another leader came over. He took the little girl aside and spoke with her.

The second leader then left the little girl and rejoined the group to lead the next activity. Before he started he said, "OK everyone, before we go any further I want you all to take your shoes and socks off and place them by the wall. For the rest of the day we're going to operate with bare-feet." The little girl who had no shoes beamed, ran over and joined in with the rest of the group.

Moral: We could all do with taking off our shoes metaphorically speaking - if we want the Lord to give us the gift of the Holy Spirit. This means becoming less dependent on the material comforts that clog up our lives so that there is no room for this great gift. In Lough Derg, the first thing you do is to take off your shoes - rich or poor ... all are alike - a sign of humility in God's Presence. The message of the Baptism of Jesus today is about ... the humility of the Lord to allow John the Baptist to baptise Him even though He had no sin ... The God of Heaven and Earth ... "took off His Shoes" ... so to speak ... to come down to the same level as mere human beings to show you and me the need to do the same when we come to receive Him in the Holy Mass.
