REFERENDUM ON SAME SEX MARRIAGE

Thursday 14th, St. Matthias, Apostle, chosen to replace Judas. Preached in Judea and Turkey. Friday 15th, St. Carthage, born Co. Kerry, 555, founded monasteries at Rahan Co. Offaly and at Lismore. Died 14th May, 637. First Bishop and Patron of Lismore.

Friday 15th, St. Dympna, 7th century, born in Ireland, martyred at Gheel in Belgium, patron saint of those who suffer from mental illnesses.

Saturday 16th, St. Brendan, 486-578, a native of Kerry he founded a monastery at Clonfert and is patron of that diocese.
