Over the coming decade 22 priests now in ministry in parishes will retire. The diocese has two students studying for the priesthood so the outlook for the short to medium term is one of a dramatic decline in the number of priests.

  Monday 12th, St. Pancras, a boy of 14 who suffered martyrdom at the same time as Sts. Nereus and Achilleus. A parish and a major railway station in London bear his name. St. Pancras International Railway Station is the London terminus of the Eurostar rail service.

Tuesday 13th, Our Lady of Fatima. The Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to three children, Francisco, Jacinta and Lucia, near Fatima, Portugal, on six occasions in 1917.

**W**ednesday 14th, St. Matthias, Apostle, chosen to replace Judas. Preached in Judea and Turkey.

Thursday 15th, St. Carthage, born Co. Kerry, 555, founded monasteries at Rahan Co. Offaly and at Lismore. Died 14th May, 637. First Bishop and Patron of Lismore.

Thursday 15th, St. Dympna, 7th century, born in Ireland, martyred at Gheel in Belgium, patron saint of those who suffer from mental illnesses.

Friday 16th, St. Brendan, 486-578, a native of Kerry he founded a monastery at Clonfert and is patron of that diocese.
