- Mass on Saturday (Vigil), 8.00 p.m.; Sunday, 10.30 a.m.; Monday, 8.00 p.m.; Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday, 9.30 a.m.
- Thursday, 15th August, is the **Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary**, a holyday of obligation. Mass at 10.30 a.m. and 8.00 p.m.
- Mass for the Intentions of the People of the Parish, Missa pro Populo, on Saturday 17th, at 8.00 p.m.
- Sunday 11th is the Feast of St. Clare, 1193-1253, born at Assisi, followed the example of St. Francis, founded the Poor Clares.

**M**onday 12th, St. Jane Frances de Chantal, 1572-1641, mother of six children, widowed at 29. Helped by St. Francis de Sales she founded several convents of the Visitation Sisters.

**M**onday 12th, St. Muredach, a disciple of St. Patrick and appointed by him as bishop of the Church of Killala. Principal patron of that diocese.

**M**onday 12th, St. Attracta, received the nun's veil from St. Patrick. Secondary patron of Achonry.

Moday 12th, St. Lelia, had a church at Killeely near Thomond Bridge, Limerick City.

Tuesday 13th, St. Pontian, Pope in 231, exiled to Sardinia, resigned the papacy so that an active person might be elected, martyred through ill treatment in exile.

Tuesday 13th, St. Hippolytus, writer and teacher, also exiled to Sardinia to suffer the same fate as St. Pontian.

Tuesday 13th, St. Fachtna, Rosscarbery, West Cork, said to have been fostered by St. Ita. Founder and principal patron of the diocese of Ross.

**W**ednesday 14th, St. Maximillian Kolbe, 1894-1941, Franciscan, worked in the religious press in Poland and Japan, died in Auschwitz so that another prisoner might live.

Friday 16th, St. Stephen of Hungary, 975-1038, first king of Hungary, worked for the conversion of his people to Christianity.

**S**aturday 17th is the Feast of Our Lady of Knock. The Liturgical Calendar and the Roman Missal give this date though, at the Shrine, the Feast is celebrated on 21st August, the anniversary of Our Lady's apparition in 1879.

- **▼ Episcopal Ordination**. Fr. Francis Duffy, bishop designate, will be ordained Bishop of Ardagh and Clonmacnois, in St. Mary's Church, Athlone, at 3.00 p.m. on Sunday 6th October.
- **▼ Cemetery Sundays:-** Saints' Island Cemetery, 18th August; Cashel Cemetery, 25th August. Mass and Prayers for the Dead, 6.00 p.m. These Masses will replace the 10.30 a.m. Mass in the Church.

**D**rivers are asked to leave the parking areas in the immediate vicinity of the cemeteries free for cars transporting persons of diminished or limited mobility. All are requested to cooperate with the stewards at Cashel Cemetery and avoid causing obstruction. The driveway into the cemetery should be used for set-down only, not for parking.

Plot holders are urged to look after the resting places of their departed.
