Reflection

An artist asked a friend if he could paint his portrait for a class assignment. The friend agreed, and the artist pointed and submitted the portrait only to receive a low grade - D minus. He was decastated. The art student approached his professor to ask why the grade was so poor. The academic told him that the proportions in the painting were attroctory incorrect. "The head is too big.", the shoulders are too wide. ... and the fect are enormous," explained the karmed don

With that, he turned on his heels and strode away arrogamly. The next day, the student brought his friend who had posed for the portrait and introduced him to the professor. The emment art expert gasped in astonishment, for his student's friend had indeed the biggest head ... the wides shoulders ... and the most enormous feet ... he had ever seen. The portrait and the reality were indistinguishable.

"My ... Word!" stammered the illustrious art critic. "Excellent ... well, well ... I never ... That's alright then ... I will *upgrade* your work." And with that, he gave the student an *A plus*.
