Tuesday 14th, St. Matthias, Apostle, chosen to replace Judas. Preached in Judea and Turkey. **W**ednesday 15th, St. Carthage, born Co. Kerry, 555, founded monasteries at Rahan Co. Offaly and at Lismore. Died 14th May, 637. First Bishop and Patron of Lismore.

**W**ednesday 15th, St. Dympna, 7th century, born in Ireland, martyred at Gheel in Belgium, patron saint of those who suffer from mental illnesses.

Thursday 16th, St. Brendan, 486-578, a native of Kerry he founded a monastery at Clonfert and is patron of that diocese.

Saturday 18th, St. John I, the first Pope to visit Constantinople, died in prison, 526.
