Message from Bishop Francis. 13th May 2018

The Eight Amendment to the Constitution is a guarantee that our laws will protect mothers and unborn babies. Without the Eighth's come babies in the womb will be repaired in a challenge of the contraction of the means lives. A society that treats some human lives as less valuable than others is putting the most vulnerable and denendmant at risk. The Eighth' is about letting live, let's keen it.

From the moment of conception human life begins its journey of growth and development. The lashy in the womb is human, genetically unique, he or she has a right to that life. Human life, once begun, should be allowed to continue until its natural end. The one definite fact about abortion is that it will end a human life. The Eight Amendment does not victimise, or deny medical treatment, instead it protects mothers and babies.

Mother of the Life Within, all life we entrust to you. The life of every expectant mother and the child within her womb, the life of every human body, the life of every human soul, the life of every human soul, the life of every new born child and the life of all grown old. You held the Lord to your own heart and drew Him so close in. so draw us now in all our needs, O Mother of the Life Within.

Reflection

A scientific researcher gathered ten volunteers for a special psychologoial study called the "sacra feet experiment". The participants are fitted with a fake facial star. They are fold they are to be interviewed to see how their new look influences the way they will be treated, Just before the interview, the scientist tells the volunteers that she has to make some last minute adjustments - but in fact, unbeknownst to the participants - the scar is removed completely. Beleving that they will have the scar on their faces, the volunteers were sent out into the wairing rooms of different medical officers ... with many patients waining to be seen. They were instructed to washed out for how strangers in the office responded to their scar.

After the appointed time, all ten participants returned with the same report. They found that strangers were more rude to them than normal, less kind and stared at their scar. It made them feel flawed and consequently more anxious and lacking in confidence. Amazingly, in some cases the belief continued even after they were shown on video that the scar had been removed.

Moral: We don't see the world as it is - we see the world as we are!

What's made clear in the experiment is this -the power of our own perception of reality... and the way we find confirmation about how we are being treated, even when none exists. A good rule of diumb is that when someone acts badly towards you, it's much more about them than about you. But if you are convinced that people are reacting badly because of some fault in you ... then you will find the evidence to back it up event it is not there.

Advice from St. Teresa of Avila:

1. Remember that your Character should always be stronger than your circumstances.

We can't always control what happens to us, but we can always control how we choose to respond. In those moments when I choose to stop complaining and instead give thanks to God for the good in my life, the parts that seem bad ... start to seem much less significant. "1. Thesalonians 5:16:18

2. Remember that your Struggles always lead to Strength.

Every difficulty in your life, whether big or small, is something God will use to produce more strength, faith and perseverance in you if you let Him! All your pain has a purpose - (like a vaccine)

"And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him" -Romans 8:28

3. Remember that God's timing is always perfect.

God's plans are almost always different from our plans, but His plans are always perfect! Have the patience to wait on His timing instead of forcing your own. "For I know the plans I have for you - plans for peace and not disaster" - Jeremiah.

4. Remember that God will never leave your side.

" Do not be afraid ... for I am with you always ... yes ... to the end of time." - Jesus.
