The Ministry of Parish Catechist: The role of the Catechist is to work alongside parish clergy, in particular with parents of candidates for the sacraments of First Holy Communion, Confirmation and also in other programmes and initiatives that help people of all ages to deepen their faith.

The Permanent Disconate: The second initiative is the introduction of the Permanent Disconate. From the earliest times the ministry of Descon has been understood as a ministry of service in the Church. Along with priest and bishop, it is one of three holy orders of the Church. In the 1960's the second Vancan Council proposed the restoration of the Disconate and, in 2006, the Holy See agreed to a request from the Irish bishops for it's restoration in Ireland.

## Pain Passes. Beauty remains.

Several years ago during a very difficult time in my life a friend shared this story with me: When French impressionist painter Auguste Renoir was confined to his home during the last decade of his life. Henri Matisse was nearly 28 years younger than him. The two great artists were dear friends and frequent companions. Matisse visited him daily. Renoir, almost parafyzed by arthritis, continued to paint in spite of his infirmities. One day as Matisse watched the elder painter work in his studio, fighting torturous pain with each brush stroke, he blurted out: "Auguste, why do you continue to paint when you are in such agony. Renoir sail: "The pain passes but the beauty remains."

Those words touched my heart in a profound way as I realized that my pain, in the hands of God, was producing a beautiful brokenness. I have never viewed suffering in the same light since then. "The Lord is near to those who have a broken heart, and saves such as have a contrite spirit." Palm 34:18

"The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit, a broken and contrite heart - these O God, you will not despise." Palm 51:17

If brokenness brings the nearness of God, why do we fight against it so much? This pain is not a master sent to rule over us, but our servant, sent to work in us that wonderful work of conforming us to Christ.

How significant our pain will be when we see it as the hand of the Potter, gently sculpting, meticulously crafting a vessel of honor fit for the Master's use. Those scarred and broken places in my soul, they are covered with his fingerprists.

The pain passes, but the beauty remains,
