Reflection on the Gospel

There's a story told of an angel sent on a mission impossible. To win one of the rival customers was an occasion for celebration. When their mutual animosity got to the stage where their children were not on speaking terms the Lord decided to step in. He sent one of his most skilled negotiators, the Archangel Raphael, with instructions to sort the sorry situation out. The angel approached one of the antagonists and told him about the Lord's concern. "Look," he said to the shopkeeper, "I've been authorised to tell you that you can have anything you wish, the finest supermarket with the very latestbusiness technology, a booming trade, security for the rest of your life.....you just name it and it's yours."
