- Monday 18th is the Feast of St. John I, the first Pope to visit Constantinople, died in prison, 526. Tuesday 19th, the Dedication of St. Mei's Cathedral, - foundation stone laid, Tuesday, 19th May, 1840; opened for divine worship, 24th September, 1856; solemn consecration, Friday, 19th May, 1893, destroyed by fire, Friday, 25th December, 2009, re-dedicated, Sunday, 17th May, 2015.

Wednesday 20th, St. Bernardine of Siena, 1380-1444, Franciscan, preached in Italy promoting devotion to the Holv Name of Jesus.

Thursday 21st, St. Christopher Magallánes and Companions, 1869-1927, a Mexican priest who resisted the anti-Church government and, with 24 companions, was martyred in 1927.

Friday 22nd, St. Rita, born in Italy,1386. On the death of her abusive husband she was admitted to the monastery of the Augustinian Nuns at Casica. She spent her time in praver, charity and devotion to Our Lord's Passion, and died of tuberculosis on 22nd May, 1457. She is a patron of abuse victims. Sunday 24th is celebrated in Australia as the Feast of Our Lady Help of Christians.

Sunday next is the Feast of Pentecost.
