Reflection: A little child on his way home from school looked into a sculptor's yard and saw a huge chunk of marble there. The sculptor was about to start working. The next day, as he passed by, he heard work going on but the doors were closed. Each day he could hear the sculptor chipping away but the doors remained tight shut. Month's later, he was passing by and the front door was open. He popped in for a look, and there on the plinth, where the block of marble had been, was a tiger, perfect and life-like in every way. The little lad tugged on the sleeve of the sculptor, and said. "How did you know there was a tiger in there?" The sculptor laughed hearthy and then proceeded to give this sublime answer.

"That's what God sees when he looks at us," my little friend, explained the master. "We are just like that chunk of marble. Our souls and characters have rough edges that need to be knocked off. Jesus alone sees the beautiful person hidden behind our rough exterior. He is the master sculptor of the soul. He, alone, can chisel away the hardened layers that life forces us to cover ourselves with."

Moral: "When I spend time before Jesus in prayer - gentle, unhurried and from the heart ... over a few days ... I find these layers begin to fall away and a noble, gentler and storger me emerges. When I'm distracted and my prayer is rushed and clinical - the bard layers start to grow back again." - St. Teresa of Avila (Doctor of the Church and great mystic).
