THE WEDDING AT CANA

 Sunday 20th, St. Sebastian, a Roman soldier, secretly helped Christians during persecution, was betrayed and subsequently martyred.

Monday 21st, St. Agnes, wealthy and beautiful, was martyred for her virginity in Rome, early 4th century. Patroness of engaged couples.

Tuesday 22nd, St. Vincent, deacon, martyred in Valencia, Spain, 304.

Thursday 24th, St. Francis de Sales, 1567-1622, bishop of Geneva, founder of the Visitation Sisters, patron of journalists.

Friday 25th, The Conversion of St. Paul - on the road to Damascus. He spent the remainder of his life preaching to the non-Jewish world.

Saturday 26th, Sts. Timothy and Titus, disciples of St. Paul and later his coworkers, to whom he wrote letters which are included in the New Testament.
