PENTECOST SUNDAY 24th May, 2015

The unexpected election of Pope Francis has been cited as an example of the Holy Spirit breathing new life and inspiration into the Church. We have all received the Spirit at our Baptism, renewed and reinforced at Confirmation. We need to remind ourselves that he's there as our potent ally and unerring guide.

- Mass on Saturday (Vigil), 8.00 p.m.; Sunday, 10.30 a.m.; Monday and Friday, 8.00 p.m.; Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, 9.30 a.m.
- ▲ Mass for the Intentions of Students Sitting Examination on Saturday 30th, at 8.00 p.m. A meeting of young people will be held in Church on Friday 29th, at 6.00 p.m., to organise and practise for the Exam Mass.
- Mass for the Intentions of the People of the Parish, on Sunday, 31st, at 10.30 a.m.
- Monday 25th is the Feast of St. Bede the Venerable, 673-735, an English monk and prolific writer, patron of scholars.

Monday 25th, St. Gregory VII, 1028-1085, Pope, worked for reform, died in exile.

Monday 25th, St. Mary Magdalene de' Pazzi, 1566-1607, Carmelite, offered her life for the spiritual renewal of the Church.

Tuesday 26th, St. Philip Neri, 1515-1607, ordained priest in Rome at 46, worked for the spiritual improvement of the Romans, renowned for his cheerfulness.

Wednesday 27th, St. Augustine of Canterbury, sent by Pope Gregory the Great to preach to the people of England; arrived in Kent in 597, died 604.

Saturday 30th, St. Joan of Arc, burned at the stake in Rouen, France, in her late teens, patroness of soldiers and of France.
