

## Reflection on Mk 10.46-52: The Blind Man and the Bumblebee

According to scientists, the bumblebee's body is too heavy and its wing span too small. Acrodynamically, the bumblebee cannot fly. But the bumblebee doesn't know that and it keeps flying.

When you don't know your limitations, sometimes you go out and surprise yourself. In hindsight, you wonder if you had any limitations. The only limitations person usually has are those that are self-imposed. If the blind man had listened to his "wise" advisers, then he never would have put his faith in Jesus and never would have been healed. Don't let others put limitations on you especially when it comes to the Lord Himself.
