

Reflection:

There is a legend told about Leonardo da Vinci of the time when he was painting The Last Supper. One day he is said to have had a big quarrel with someone. Afterward, he went to his studio and began to paint the face of Jesus. But he found, to his utter dismay, that there was a strange feeling in his hand, and it became impossible to use the brush with any effect. He immediately left the place, went to the man he had fought with, and asked his forgiveness. When he returned to the studio and resumed painting the face of Jesus, he could paint with ease. The German philosopher Schopenhauer compared the human race to a bunch of porcupines huddling together on a cold winter's night. He said "The colder it gets outside, the more we huddle together for warmth; but the closer we get to one another, the more we hurt one another with our sharp spindles. And in the lonely night of earth's winter, eventually we begin to drift apart and wander out on our own and freeze to death in our loneliness."

Moral:

Christ has given us an alternative: encounter his transforming and forgiving presence like the unjust fraud Zachaeus. Then we will become like the just and generous Zachaeus.
