Monday, 1st June, St. Justin, born in the Holy Land, settled in Rome where he opened a school, martyred 165.

Wednesday 3rd, St. Kevin, principal patron Diocese of Dublin, wanted to be a hermit but followers gathered around him at Glendalough forming a monastic settlement. He died 618.

Thursday 4th, the Ugandan Martyrs, St. Charles Lwanga and Companions, 22 Ugandan youths martyred 1886.

Friday 5th, St. Boniface, 673-754, born in Devonshire, England, went as a missionary to the continent, appointed Bishop of Mainz, Germany; founded monasteries in Bavaria, martyred 754.

Saturday 6th, St. Jarlath, founder and first bishop of the Diocese of Tuam, sixth century.

Saturday 6th, St. Norbert, 1080-1134, Founder of the Norbertines or Premonstratensians (as formerly at Kilnacrott).
